Jeff Edwards - UW Extension

Sheridan high tunnel, low tunnel, open field trial results

Ami Erickson - Sheridan College

Peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, green beans, and broccoli were grown in high tunnels, low tunnels, and in the open at the Sheridan Research and Extension Center over two growing seasons to compare strategies for season extension. Ami will share the results and discuss strategies that may help you improve your vegetable harvests in our short growing season.

When growing vegetables, pests are not a matter of if, but when. Jeff will provide management tactics for weeds, diseases, insects, and rodents in production, with an emphasis of enclosed spaces.

Hands-on low tunnel build

Weather dependent, participants will construct a low tunnel in the Sheridan College Ag Field lab using 3 ft high metal frames and thick poly. We will also discuss strategies to get the most out of low tunnels for season extension and the types of materials that can be used.
